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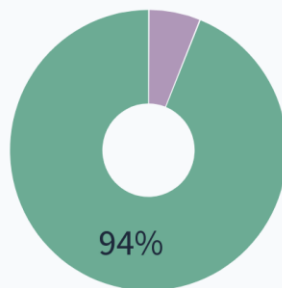
## PQS part 1

- Confirm on MYS
- Actions
  - Covid risk assessment
  - Maximise social distancing
  - Updated SOPs
  - Display up to date Covid posters
  - Briefing team members of risk factors and offer and undertake risk assessment and mitigation for each member of the staff as requested
  - Process for referring staff
  - Provision of facilities and posters for appropriate hand sanitisation
  - Adopt appropriate PPE guidelines
  - Review business continuity plan
  - Area in pharmacy for insulating customers with symptoms
  - Reviewed and adopted examples of good practice
  - Contractor and registered staff have read guidance on GPhC website

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
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# Domain 1 Infection Prevention & Control and AMS

- **Non-registered pharmacy staff** - complete the HEE infection prevention and control Level 1 e-learning and assessment
- **Registered pharmacy professionals** - completed the HEE Infection Prevention and Control Level 2 e-learning and assessment
- Completed a team review with documented reflections and actions and SOPs
- **All patient-facing pharmacy staff** have satisfactorily completed the PHE Antimicrobial Stewardship for Community Pharmacy e-learning and e-assessment
- Develop an antimicrobial stewardship action plan for the pharmacy and evidence of completion
- **All patient facing staff** should become Antibiotic Guardians, and have an awareness of the local antibiotic formulary.

**Antibiotic resistance remains one of the biggest threats facing us today.**

Why it is relevant to you: without effective antibiotics many routine treatments will become increasingly dangerous. Setting broken bones, basic operations, even chemotherapy and animal health all rely on access to antibiotics that work.

What we want you to do: It is important to remember that antibiotics do not treat or prevent viruses, including the one that causes COVID19. To slow resistance we need to cut the unnecessary use

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## Domain 2 Prevention

### Suicide prevention

- **All patient-facing staff** must have completed the Zero Suicide Alliance (ZSA) training
- Prepare and implement an action plan which includes the action to take if anyone reports to staff that they have suicidal feelings.

### Sugar sweetened beverages

- Sales of Sugar Sweetened Beverages must account for no more than 10% by volume in litres of all beverages sold.



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## Domain 2 Prevention

### Obesity

- **All non-registered patient-facing pharmacy staff** must have completed the PHE All Our Health bitesize training and assessments on Adult Obesity and Childhood Obesity
- **80% of registered pharmacy professionals** must have satisfactorily completed sections 1 and 3 of the 'CPPE Weight management for adults: understanding the management of obesity training' and assessment
- Prepare and implement an action plan of how they will proactively engage with people to discuss weight and assist a person who would like support with their weight.
- The pharmacy team has a record over a period of 4 consecutive weeks of the total number of people who
  - had a conversation with a trained member of the pharmacy team about the benefits of achieving a healthy BMI and who have been shown how to self-measure and calculate their BMI and self-measure their waist circumference; and
  - were referred to other services for weight management support, e.g. physical activity.



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## Domain 3 Risk management

- **80% of all registered pharmacy professionals** must have satisfactorily completed the CPPE risk management training and e-assessment (if not completed previously before 2018)
- The pharmacy must have available a new risk review or an update of the previous risk review including reflection on the risk of missing sepsis identification and the risk minimisation actions and the risk of missing red flag symptoms during OTC consultations

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## Domain 4 PCN - Prevention

- Engage with the Pharmacy PCN Lead to communicate that they would like to be involved in increasing the uptake of flu vaccination to patients aged 65 and over.
- Scaled point score based on local performance and prescription volume



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## Flu performance targets

	Band 1	Band 2	Band 3	Band 4	Band 5	Band 6
Point per 0.1 percentage point increase between 70.1% and 77%	0.0107	0.0750	0.1607	0.2143	0.3214	0.3750

Percent vaccination achieved – 77%

PQS points  $((77-70)\div 0.1) \times 0.2143$

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## Domain 5 PCN- Business continuity

- Contractors must have participated in a discussion, organised by the Pharmacy PCN lead, regarding business continuity planning



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## Requirements for PCN Business Continuity Planning

- Share contractor survey
- Produce summary high level BCP
- Identify actions to complete and ensure they are completed
- Collaborate with other HC providers re temporary closure
- Share top line plan with Clinical Director
- Understand the general practice BCP
- Update and share final BCP with contractors

- Team review of infection prevention and control
- SOP for infection prevention and control

- Four weeks data collection regarding weight management advice

- Training plan



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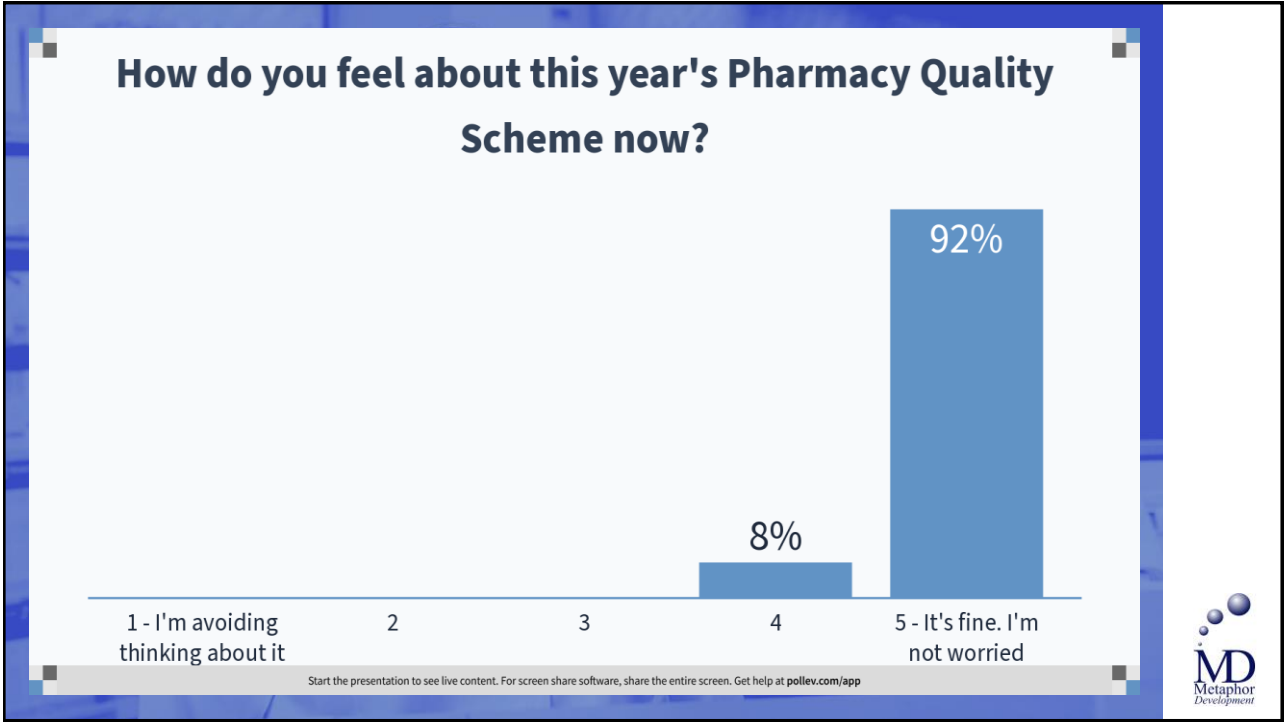
